ROAD MAP to a great story TARGET GROUP




what is the Goal?

During the 5 interactive seminar sessions

- You will listen to examples from decades of practice
- You will understand why stories are important
- You will learn to craft your own stories and panoramas/summaries
- You will learn how to tell a story

The online seminar is split into five sessions, so that you can practice between the sessions. There will



also be time to evaluate the stories told between the sessions.

Four Fields

This webinar follows the pattern of the "Four Fields", a parable from Mark 4:26-29. Result: At the end of session 5 every participant will have at least five tools ready (stories) which he or she can use in everyday life with Germans, Americans, Asians, refugees, and other migrants. You will need a Gmail-address for getting access to a google drive in order to do the homework.

You will need 30-60 minutes every time for the homework.
